On December 8, 2024, Syrian rebels made a surprising move and took control of the capital city, Damascus, without facing much resistance. President Bashar al-Assad, who had been in power for 13 years, fled the country and went to Russia for safety. His family also went with him. This sudden change marked the end of the Assad family's rule in Syria, which had lasted for more than 60 years.

This event was a huge shock to the Middle East. It ended a long war that started in 2011, when many people in Syria protested against Assad's government. The war led to a lot of destruction, with hundreds of thousands of people dying, cities being destroyed, and millions of people forced to leave their homes and become refugees in other countries.
