Required:

Reading-

1. Read Flat Stanley by Jeff Brown
2. Book Report (attached)
3. Color and cut out Stanley to take on adventures (attached)
4. Stanley's Summer Adventure- please document (picture) **2 different** "adventures" that Stanley went on with your family this summer. The adventure can be anything from a vacation, to a visit to the pool or lunch at Skyline. In addition to each adventure's picture, please write a detailed, complete sentence (for each adventure) documenting Stanley's fun.

Math-

- Please go over addition and subtraction math facts up to 20. It is important to build fact fluency! A test will be given on the first week of school to gauge mastery of facts.

Summer Solutions or Summer Bridge (can be purchased on Amazon or Joseph Beth) practice book:

*We recommend buying 1 math and 1 reading

- Grade 1 Mathematics

Reviews all math skills taught in first grade.

- Grade 1 Reading Comprehension

If your child struggled with fluently reading grade appropriate passages, answering literal or inferential questions, or was below 60 words per minute at the end of the year, this is your "go to" review book.

- Grade 2 Standards-Based Grammar and Mechanics

If your child was on-level with fluent reading but struggled with spelling, grammar, parts of speech, punctuation, etc. this is your "go to" literacy review book.

Word Lists: Attached are the 1st Grade Memory Words. Write out these words on flashcards and have your child speed read and practice spelling each memory word.

- Speed read- Have your child read as many flashcards as they can for 1 minute. Count their total. Start over and time them again for another minute. See if they can beat their score.

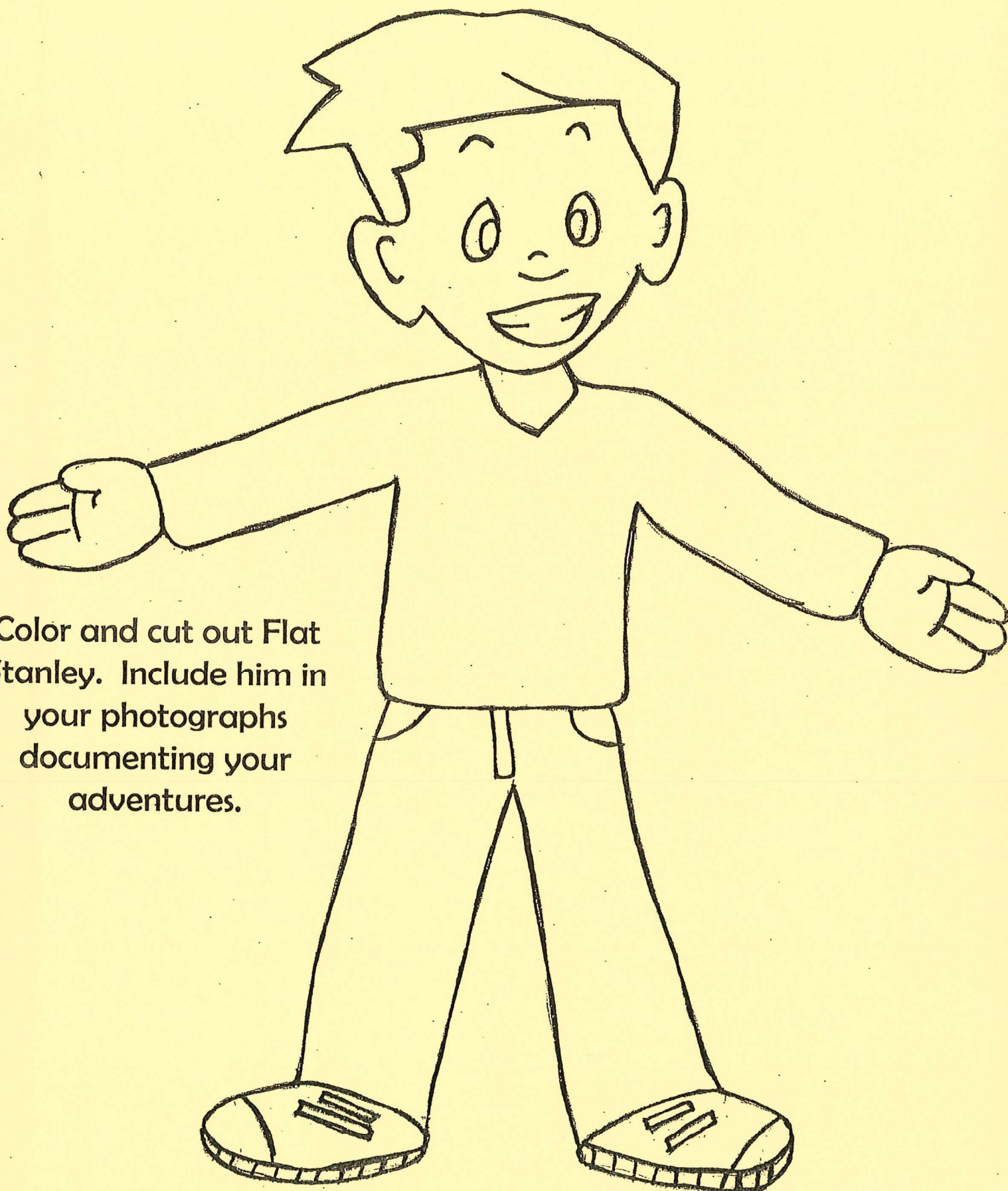
